

## A message from Pastor Dave...

## Pasto Dave's 2022 Annual Report

Let's start with a question, a question that many of you have already asked yourselves about the future of our church: As the years go by, what is going to happen to our church?

Numerically, like almost every other church in America, our worship attendance is declining and has been for over 40 years. More than once I've heard some of you describe our church by saying, "Our church has an old congregation." As a case in point, six years ago when I preached my very first sermon here at St. Matthew, I was all set to do a Children's Sermon but there was only one problem... there were no kids in church, none at all, not even one! Today, we have many children and youth participating in worship every Wednesday at WOW. That is a blessing, and that is what we are called to be as a church. Still, challenges remain.

Overall, worship attendance for Sunday and WOW declined from 182/week in 2019 to 111/week in 2022, a 38% decrease! These deeply troubling trends in worship attendance are consistent with national trends. Nationwide worship attendance has declined by 35% percent from 2019 to 2022. Declining worship attendance at St. Matthew is attributable to long-term, and on-going, cultural dynamics, the aging of our congregation, and the effect of coronavirus.

Those of us who love God, and love the church, feel sadness and sorrow over the decline of the church in America, and specifically the decline of worship attendance here at St. Matthew. Although I've only been here six short years, I've personally witnessed, and felt, the loss of so many of our beloved members, members who loved God and loved our church. Over the last six years I conducted funerals for the following people.

As time goes by, whether we like it or not, change happens. I recently heard it said that change is inevitable, but growth is optional. There's no doubt that our church is changing, but that does not mean that our church will disappear in the future. As our church continues to change, how we measure the success or failure of our congregation hinges upon whose criteria we use. I read somewhere that God has a different perspective on his church than most of us. In Isiah 55:8-9 God said, "My thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are my ways your ways, for as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts higher than your thoughts."

Coming out of the corporate realm, my thoughts naturally tend to gravitate toward numerical analyses, counting success and failure in human terms. It's been hard for me to fully grasp and embrace the reality that God has a whole different way of measuring the worth of a man or woman and the worth of a church. In John 13:34-35, Jesus told us what's important to God when He said, "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my people, if you love one another." It's important for us to remember that Jesus doesn't worry about the things that most of us worry about. Did you hear that... Jesus doesn't worry about the things that most of us worry about! Let that sink in, and remember it the next time you start worrying about things that don't even matter to God.

On a personal note, I turned 65 years old this past summer but am hard pressed to come up with any advantages to getting old - my hair is getting greyer and thinner, my waist is getting bigger, my body aches in ways it never did before and they tell me it's not going to get better any time soon. However, as we prepared the new church budget for 2023 I discovered one advantage to getting old. Because I'm now on Medicare, our church will save over \$7,000.00 per year on my health insurance costs Thank God for small miracles!

As we enter 2023, our church is not what it used to be, but in all the ways that matter to God it's as good as it ever was, maybe even better because being grateful, gracious, and generous counts for much in God's economy. As we enter 2023 we are financially strong and – thanks be to God – becoming ever more spiritually humble, what a beautiful and godly combination that is! Thank you for allowing me to serve as your pastor, and thank you for your generous support of ministry at St. Matthew. Peace be with you in 2023, and beyond.
