

## A message from Pastor Dave...

The season of Lent is a perfect time for reflection. As I contemplate the cross, two things come to mind. First, the radically transformational power of grace; and second, the counter-cultural nature of the cross.

It's hard for most of us mainstream, middle-class Christians to fully grasp how radically counter-cultural the cross of Jesus Christ really was, and still is today. Most of us are not very comfortable with thoughts, words, and deeds that run contrary to our deep seated social, political, and cultural comfort zones. And, given how things are in the world today, we often feel overwhelmed and anxious, sometimes even unsafe. One author described the world like this.

It is self-evident that the world is more wicked and immoral than it has ever been before. There is no good government, no true faith, no fidelity, no obedience - only selfish perversity and people in need of correction. The world is full of suffering, shame, misery, and unfaithfulness because so many people want to be free of all authority, and do whatever they please, no matter who it hurts. Children and people of all ages are wild and out of control.

That is how Martin Luther described the world 500 years ago! The book of Ecclesiastes provides perspective: *What has been will be again, what has been done will be done again; there is nothing new under the sun (Ecc.1:9).* 

Thank God for the radically transformational power of grace; for by it even the least of us, and even the worst of us, can experience radical renewal, recovery, restoration, and revitalization.

If you've ever seen a person's life changed by faith, then you know the power of grace. If you've ever prayed for someone who desperately needs a new attitude and approach to life, there's only one thing that can help them - the radically transformational power of grace.

I thank God for the overflowing and abundant grace that I've experienced in my life, and I pray that your life may be filled with the love and grace of God as well. He Is Risen! He Is Risen, Indeed!

#### St Matthew Lutheran Church Annual Meeting January 29<sup>th</sup>, 2024

Called to Order by President Jeff Hinrichs. The annual meeting was held on Jan. 29th, 2024 following morning services (39 members present). Pastor opened with prayer. Minutes: The minutes from the 2023 annual meeting were reviewed. Merle Gerdes made a motion to accept the minutes and Kathy Gerdes seconded. Motion carried. Pastor's Report: Pastor Dave highlighted key events that happened during the last year. Pastor also expressed appreciation to our council members for their service, and noted that he has now been serving as our pastor for 7 years. He reported that, in that time, we have lost many dedicated and devoted church members to illness and death. President's Report: Jeff Hinrichs expressed the appreciation to all the staff, volunteers, and members of St. Matthews Lutheran Church for the success of 2023. Board of Elders: Carolyn Dirks reported that homebound communion is going well. People receiving the communion appreciate the fellowship with the people visiting. Board of Deacons: Nine charities received \$300.00 each from Benevolence: Austin Strong Foundation; Friends of the Library; Avenue of Flags; Sleep in Heavenly Peace; Monticello Senior Dining; ELCA Disaster Relief; ELCA Global Relief; Monticello Shop with Cop; and, the Monticello Food Pantry. An additional \$150.00 each went to Advancement Services of Monticello and Systems Unlimited of Monticello. Board of Trustees: Jeff Hinrichs reported that the church sign in front of the church had the clear panels replaced with new lexan. The carpet was replaced on the front steps and the education unit entry. The third AC unit was added for the sanctuary. Also railings were added to the elevator entrance.

**Youth Ministry:** The report was reviewed. Trisha Lambert highlighted that the Youth Program had a great 2023 year.

WELCA Report: Reviewed. It was a great year with an excellent Fall Dinner! Treasurer's Report: The treasurer's report was presented and reviewed.

**Endowment Fund:** Report was reviewed. **Memorial Fund:** Report was reviewed. Stu Gerdes made a motion to accept the above reports as presented. Merle Gerdes seconded. Motion carried.

Old Business: There was no old business.

**New Business:** The 2024 budget was reviewed; Jeff Hinrichs described changes from last years budget. DaLana Rigby made a motion to accept the 2024 budget as presented. Deb Kuhn seconded. Motion carried. Next on the agenda was the topic of organ repair. After discussion, and in consideration of limited organist availability and our church's financial situation, it was decided not to spend the substantial amount of money required for repairs (over \$34,000.00). We will use the organ for as long as we can, then for the long-term good of the church we will explore purchasing a high quality key board that can be used with our sound system (est. cost \$3,000.00). Stu Gerdes made a motion to adjourn and Carolyn Dirks seconded. Motion carried. Closed with the Lord's Prayer.


