

My favorite season used to be Fall, but not for the reason that some of you may suspect. I really wasn't that much of a college football fan earlier in my life, because I was always so busy hunting from September to December. I loved being in God's great outdoors, experiencing the wonders of nature in Iowa, Wisconsin, South Dakota, Wyoming, Montana, Colorado, New Mexico, British Columbia, Manitoba, Ontario, Alaska, and the Northwest Territories over the years. Those were some great trips, adventures that filled my soul and satisfied my craving for... for what?

Over the years, I've told friends and family that when I was on those hunting trips, I never felt more alive. What makes you feel most alive? All year long I looked forward to, and lived for, those great adventures. It was my passion in life, and then it was gone. My car accident made me a felon, so I am no longer allowed to possess or use firearms. My great hunting adventures came to an end so quickly, and so unexpectedly, that I still haven't gotten over the pain of losing something that I loved so much. And, I also have to deal with the reality that it was my own sin that caused my loss.

Most of you know what it's like to experience a devastating loss. Many of you have experienced traumatic losses in your lives, events that crushed your soul and left you aching for what you lost. That includes such things as the pain and discomfort of death, disease, disability, divorce, job loss, and on it goes. No matter the cause, when our lives are forever changed by loss we have a choice to make. In each and every crises we face, there is a good and godly way to respond and an ungodly way to respond. The defining moments of our lives set us on one path or the other.

I thank God that my Lutheran heritage and upbringing gave me a foundation of faith to draw upon when my own sin (my car accident) led to a catastrophe that devastated two families. In prison, I had a choice to make: to turn away from God or toward God. We all know people who turned away from God when they had nowhere else to turn, and we all know people who turned toward God when they had nowhere else to turn.

Announcing a \$12,368.00 Per Year Cost Savings for Our Church

As of August 15th we have changed from a paid janitor to volunteers doing janitorial work. This will save our church \$8,268.00 per year. Also, Tricia & Tim Lambert, our Youth and Family Ministry leaders, have generously offered to take a 50% reduction in their pay saving the church \$4,100.00 per year. In addition, Rosy Hurt our secretary, bookkeeper, and payroll administrator only works 10 hours per week.
